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Course Descriptions

High School Credit Courses

English Part 1 (Freshmen & Sophomores)

This course provides opportunities for students to apply appropriate reading strategies to enhance reading skills, literary appreciation, and analysis of literary and structural elements of literature.

English Part 2 (Freshmen & Sophomores)

This basic grammar course will focus on parts of speech, punctuation, spelling skills, sentence structure, reading responses, a novel study, and essay writing format.

English Part 1 (Juniors & Seniors)

This course provides opportunities for students to apply appropriate reading strategies to enhance reading skills, literary appreciation, and analysis of literary and structural elements of literature.

English Part 2 (Juniors & Seniors)

This basic grammar course will focus on parts of speech, punctuation, spelling skills, sentence structure, reading responses, a novel study, and essay writing format.

Biology

Biology is a course designed to study in-depth subjects in Life Science. Themes running throughout the Summer Session are reproduction and inheritance, development, structure and function, inter-relationships ecology and sciences as it relates to society.

Sciences

This is a general science class for grades 9 - 12. It will cover scientific inquiry and relate science to our everyday world.

Algebra 1

This course will include a review of general Algebra concepts including expressions, equations factoring and graphing.

Algebra 2

This course extends coverage of traditional Algebra 1 concepts. The applications of algebraic skills in a variety of problem-solving situations are included. The course is appropriate for students who have a solid foundation in Algebra 1.

Pre-Calculus & Physics

Scheduling must be done directly through the Head of Summer Programming.



Geometry

This is an applied geometry course designed for students who either need support in geometry or who do not plan to pursue careers in the scientific or engineering fields. Emphasis will be placed on concepts of geometry, and their applications to real life situations.

Classical History

This course will focus on a comprehensive look at the societies of ancient Egypt, Greece, and Rome, with a emphasis on their contributions to the modern world.

Modern History

This course covers the Renaissance, the Scientific Revolution, the Industrial Revolution, Nationalism, Imperialism, and the World Wars.

Middle School Enrichment Courses

Mathematics enrichment & Pre-Algebra Prep

There will be an emphasis on reviewing basic computational skills (addition, subtract, multiplication, and division) as well as an introduction to the fundamentals of Algebra. Technology may be integrated into this class.

Reader's/Writer's Workshop

This course is designed for Middle School students who wish to further develop their English language skills. The focus will be on group work to develop speaking, listening, reading comprehension and language skills. Technology may be integrated into this class.

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Registration

Summer School Dates:

Regular Schedule: June 9 - June 28, 2018

How to Register:

1. Fill out a registration form. These can be found in the Business Office, Middle School Office, or High School Office. Be sure to use a separate application form for each student.
2. Submit the completed registration form along with payment to the American School of Kuwait Business Office.

Important: In order to receive credit for courses, students must have failed the credit course previously. Students must have a counselor or administrator sign their registration certifying the failure.

Cancellation Policy:
